I have had the privilege of participating as a board member of the Levine Jewish Community Center and Temple Beth El at different times in my 18 years here in Charlotte. And I'm fairly cer-

tain that the budget challenges I observed every single year were just as commonly experienced Temple Israel, our



schools, the Hebrew Cemetery and throughout our Jewish agencies. Every year we are collectively faced with how to fund the very things our families want. Every year each of us hears the call to contribute more to the Jewish organizations that mean so much to our families.

Believing the time is Now for addressing the long term funding challenge, FCJC stepped up to develop and lead the Create Your Jewish Legacy (CJL) initiative. While probably not as well known or understood as some of our Jewish organizations, FCJC saw the need to move beyond its more recognizable role of investing and

administering Jewish agency endowments. Over the last 18 months we've researched other successful legacy initiatives across the country, received critical grants to fund our own CJL initiative, and organized our synagogues, schools, Federation, and other Jewish agencies to begin having legacy conversations. While perhaps still not a household name, FCJC is a partner to each of the Charlotte Jewish agencies most important to you. Together we're educating our community about the need and ease of supporting our cherished Jewish organizations after we die, just as we have in our lifetimes. It can be as simple as listing your desired agency, synagogue, or the Federation as an additional beneficiary on your life insurance or IRA, and does not impact your current giving.

As I step down as president of the FCJC board, I reflect on how FCJC has grown to meet the needs

of our Jewish community. I've seen the dedication of our lay leaders and professional staff as they searched for and found a path to help all our Jewish agencies move closer to long-term financial health and stability. And I am always excited to hear about board members and volunteers at our Jewish agencies stepping up with their own bequests and asking others about the legacy they want

to leave in Charlotte.

What started as a whisper is gaining its voice, and surely will become a loud and successful call to action to secure the future of our Jewish community. \$\Phi\$


