Rebbe from Soviet prison. His arrest was due to his active involvement in sustaining Jewish life in the Soviet Union and his subsequent release was seen as a ray of hope for the future of Soviet Jewry.

The American holiday is the 4th of July, which celebrates America's independence. America has become a haven for freedom where Jews can and are encouraged to practice their religion without fear of persecution. In addition, America has been the place where many Jews fleeing the horrors of the Holocaust and the hard life in the former Soviet Union have settled. America has replaced Europe as the center of Jewish life in the Diaspora.
