TIRS is Changing to Meet Your Needs

Temple Israel Religious School (TIRS) is eager to share with you our new model for Religious Education, which will be implemented this coming fall. The positive and exciting changes are based not only on a survey sent to our Religious School families, but also well-documented national trends happening all around us.

The major trend to emerge is that families are looking for more *flexibility* in how they learn about Judaism. A TIRS Task Force made up of a variety of members of our community worked diligently for several months to develop a strategic plan to address the

issue. This plan, recently approved by the Temple Israel Board of Trustees, will allow your children to attend the Temple Israel Religious School in a manner that best fits your family's lifestyle.



Starting in the fall, Required Educational Opportunities are:

- Sunday Religious School Classes, Grades K-7 3 hours
- *Hebrew Study*, using an online application that will reinforce concepts and skills presented in the classroom on Sundays.

Additional Educational and Social Opportunities include:

- *Tuesday Religious School Classes*, Grades 3-7 –1.5 hours, led by our clergy and faculty
- Saturday Junior Congregation, Grades K-6
- *Differentiated Learning* for extra help or accelerated instruction at no extra charge for all 3rd-7th grade TIRS students
- Temple Israel Youth Group enrollment, at no additional cost for all TIRS students

Our ultimate goal is to nurture our children to celebrate their Jewish identity in the context of our modern American lives, and to commit to a life of Jewish living and learning. We will be ready to launch TIRS registration mid-May, so be on the lookout for registration details.
