Butterfly Project's Next Wing Takes Flight (Come Watch!)

The Butterfly Project at the Levine Jewish Community Center is excited to announce that work will begin mid-October installing hand-painted ceramic butterflies on a new wing of the Children's Holocaust Memorial Sculpture in the Margaret and Lou Schwartz Butterfly Garden. The artists, Paul Rousso and Patrick Robertson, will be out in the garden installing butterflies on this wing. Feel free to stop by and watch these creative individuals bring more of the sculpture to life.

The Memorial Sculpture designed by Paul Rousso and installed in 2011 currently has more than 2,800 butterflies affixed to it in mosaic style. Those butterflies were painted by children, teens and adults from all over Charlotte and the surrounding communities on the main wings. It is a beautiful and meaningful symbol honoring the memory of the 1.5 million Jewish children who perished in the Holocaust.

Since the creation of the garden and installation of the sculpture in

2011, more than 9,000 students have participated in the Butterfly Project workshops. The workshops use the story of the Holocaust as a vehicle to teach what can happen when prejudice, stereotyping and discrimination are allowed to flourish. During the 2-½ hour experience, participants hear from a Holocaust survivor, participate in an educational discussion to build bridges of communication, understanding and respect for all people, paint a ceramic butterfly in memory of a specific child who perished in the Holocaust, and visit the Margaret and Lou Schwartz Butterfly Garden. For the 2014-15 school year, more than 4,300 students are already scheduled to attend a workshop.

To experience a workshop firsthand, the Butterfly Project encourages you to attend our Community Workshop on Sunday,
