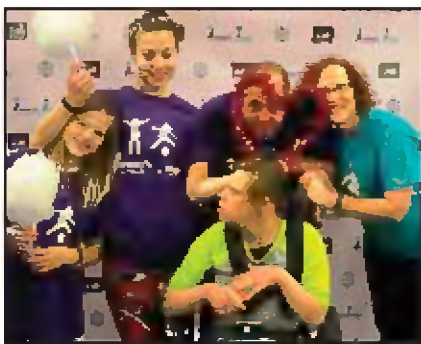


Jump for Friendship - Part III

We are an unaffiliated congregation composed of the diverse Jewish community in the York County area—more traditional Jews, interfaith couples and families and Jews who may be rediscovering their faith. We hold Shabbat service the first and third Friday of every month at the beautiful historic chapel of Unity Presbyterian at 303 Tom Hall Street in Fort Mill, SC. Our Religious School has grown to over 30 kids who love coming to Sunday School and are

solidifying their identities as Jews (classes have just started and it's not too late to enroll your child). Tzedakah and tikkun olam, core principles of Judaism, will have even greater focus for our congregation in the coming year. We recently completed a food drive during the High Holidays to benefit Jewish Family Services and are planning a CardioFunk (kind of like Zumba but even more fun) session on October 10 in conjunction with Breast Cancer Awareness month to raise funds for a cancer organization. Additionally, the Religious School will complete a school-wide Mitzvah Project this coming year which will benefit a local York County organization.
