Gay Parents Group No Longer A Handful

What began as a dream nearly a year ago has grown into a reality for a group of gay parents in the Charlotte area.

According to Mark Drum, acting president of the newly re-organized Gay Parents Coalition, the group has grown from a small handful of men trying to deal with their role as parents, to an organization ready to help both gay men and lesbians.

From its early beginnings as the Gay Fathers Coalition, the group has re-directed its outreach to include lesbian mothers and draws members from as far away as Raleigh. Membership has quadrupled in the past six months.

Sexual Responsibility

Legal Issues Facing Gay Parents
The sessions were lead by qualified professionals such as counselors, physicians and lawyers.

Drum said, "The key to the success of the group has been the dedication of members and the quality of programs. Many of our speakers are gay parents themselves and have shared their experiences with the group as well."

The groups' outreach extends not 1606.

only to gay parents but to their companions, friends, children and spouses (both current and ex). Lovers of gay parents ("co-parents," as the group refers to them) have played key roles in the development and success of the group, according to Drum.

Members come from all age groups and professional backgrounds. Some are still married and living with spouses; others are divorced; still others are separated. Some have come out to their families; others have not.

During the next year, the group hopes to provide opportunities for their children to meet one another in a "Kid-nic," tentatively planned for August. Long-range plans have been discussed to sponsor a Southeastern Regional Conference for Gay and Lesbian Parenting Issues.

The group publishes a monthly newsletter for members and associate members. Memberships for parents are \$10 per year and \$5 for associate members. Friends and co-parents are encouraged to join.
