# UNCC Professor Finds Parents Quite Accepting

A study by a professor at UNC-Charlotte shows that 97% of parents who are members of Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gay Men (PFLAG) eventually come to terms with their child's sexual orientation.

Results of the study by Dr. Bryan Robinson and his colleagues at UNCC and the University of Georgia will be published in the April issue of Psychology Today. The research, initiated in 1980 and funded by UNCC, is the first major study of this nature since the 1960s.

Robinson, associate professor of child and family development, presented preliminary findings at the February meeting of the Charlotte chapter of PFLAG. Early findings included responses from 400 of the 700 questionnaires mailed to families with gay children.

He told PFLAG that earlier research decades ago indicating that most gays suffer from emotional imbalance and depression was skewed because all 106 gays in that study were at that time in therapy for depression; the control group of 106 heterosexuals were not. He admitted that his own research may be skewed in the other direction because respondents to his questionnaire were primarily mothers of gays.

### QCC's February Events Earn \$784

Thanks to hundreds of supportive, fun-loving people, QCC's February events earned \$784 above expenses.
