The Gay and Lesbian Switchboard of Charlotte, sponsored by the Metrolina Community Services Project (MCSP), announced plans for a fall training session for new volunteers, Saturday and Sunday October 15 and 16 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm both days.

The Gay and Lesbian Switchboard is an information, referral and peer crisis telephone counseling service which is open from 6:30 to 10:30 pm seven nights a week.

The training session, titled the "Counseling Skills Workshop," is open to anyone who wishes to participate. There is no commitment to become a Switchboard volunteer. Class topics will include Crisis Intervention, Listening Skills, AIDS and Safe Sex,

Resource Familiarization and Referral Techniques, and role-playing to provide "handson" experience.

Volunteer counselors deal with callers in all sorts of situations. You don't know what problems you'll be faced with when the phone rings. But the training is designed to try to provide the skills necessary for the volunteer counselor to deal positively with whatever comes along, to expect the unexpected.
