The family of Matthew Shepard has formed a foundation in the name of the slain University of Wyoming student to help people "embrace and rejoice in diversity." Shepard, 21, was beaten, tied to a fence and left to die after leaving a Laramie bar with his accused assailants. Shepard, who was gay, died of his injuries several days later. His beating and death brought an outpouring of offers of financial help to his
