Mr. J. D. Monroe, former construction timekeeper, was in town recently. He is now a merchant at Lumberton, N. C.

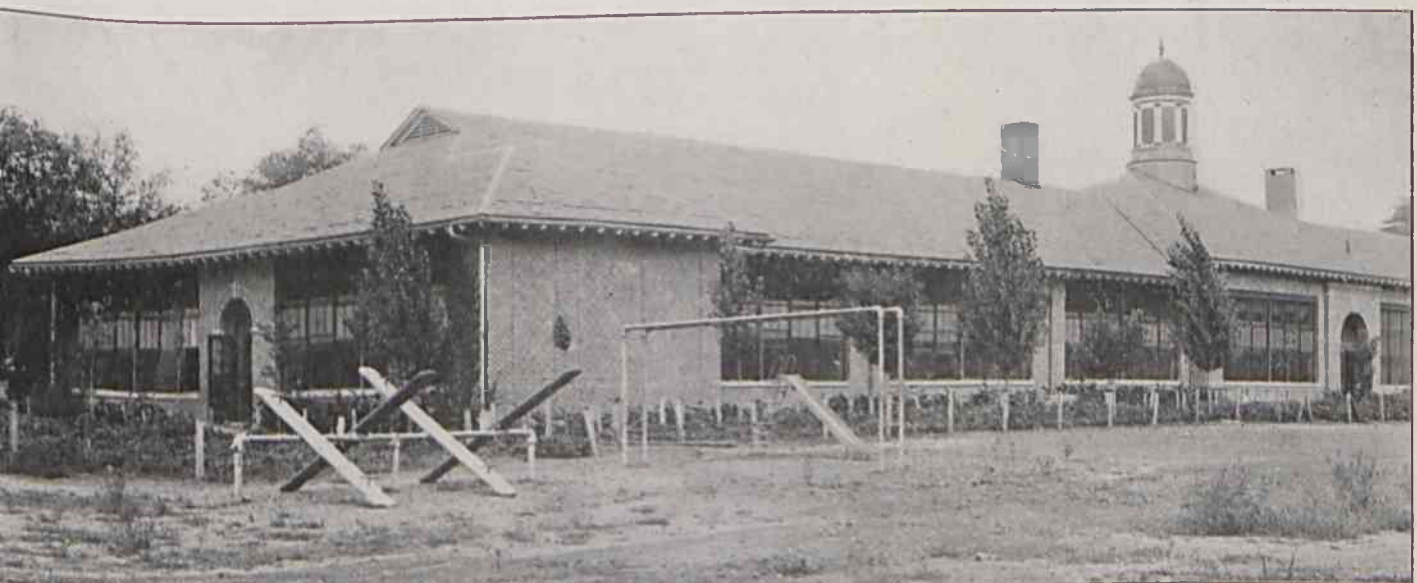
The colored settlement will soon boast of the finest school-building for negro children in this State. All the four hundred houses here are either occupied or waiting for a tenant, and all are

equipped with water, sewerage, and electric lights, while new water lines are being laid for two hundred of the homes. A separate sewage disposal plant is under construction. There are also three larger boarding houses, a pleasant theater, a dance hall, and a large pool room.
