Offensive in The Central Pacific

Conclusions drawn in the middle of a campaign, especially when they are not based upon first-hand material, must always be tentative. However, some broad generalizations about the conduct of the war in the Pacific may be based upon one of our greatest offensive victories: the conquest of the Marshalls.

It is now perfectly clear that the successful prosecution of the war in the Pacific does not wait upon the collapse of the Third Reich. Enough war material is See OFFENSIVE, page 4

Classification Survey Made Of Crew Here

The Navy Department's classification survey of all enlisted men on shore stations reached the Pre-Flight School last Monday and Tuesday when a group of six classification experts rapidly but systematically interviewed members of the crew here.

Aim of the survey, according to BuPers' Enlisted Classification Section, is to put "the right man in the right billet." To accomplish this, every enlisted man's background, hobbies, physical characteristics, educational and vocational experiences are recorded through personal interviews, and the information becomes a permanent part of the individual's file.

The survey is intended to benefit both the Navy and the men themselves. Based on results obtained, the men, within the limits of wartime necessity, are channeled into assignments for which they are best fitted and therefore are able to advance the farthest. On the other hand, the objective is to
