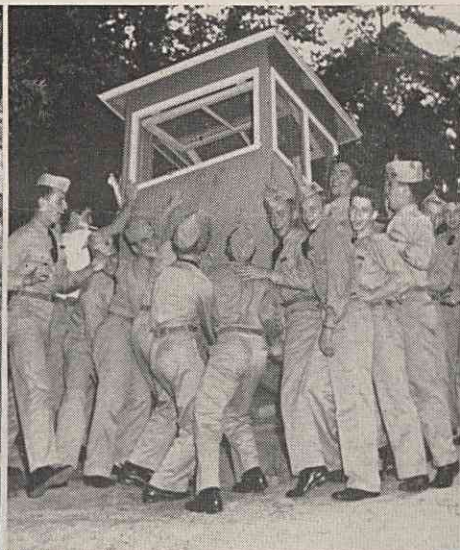


WHEN PEACE CAME...



WHEN at 1900 on Tuesday, Aug. 14, President Truman announced to the waiting nation that the Japanese had surrendered, a tidal wave of excitement and jubilation engulfed the station and rolled into town. It was not V-J Day, but its effect was electric in sparking coast-to-coast celebrations by a peace loving people. Navy photographer Harold E. Hanson hurriedly deserted a steak dinner at the Cloudbuster baseball banquet to film the reactions of Pre-Flight personnel shown on this page.
