Gastonia received a letter from Mr. Bob Girardin at Wilson congratulating us on a fine example of process improvement. He was referring to fiberglass headers and how they had reduced the scrap in Wilson's process.

Jaggy Anand and I returned from our Mexico trip encouraged by what we had seen. As reported in a previous newsletter, Gastonia has shipped fabric to Cuernavaca, Mexico for the first time in more than a year. We had lost this business because they could buy a better quality of fabric from ASAHI. The specific reason for this visit was to follow our fabric through Mexico's process. Cuernavaca was impressed at the improvement in the quality of our nylon fabric. We also had the opportunity to see material produced my ASAHI and were very impressed. Their nylon is flat and very uniform from one end to the other. We will need everyone's input and cooperation if we are to replace ASAHI as the major supplier of fabric to Mexico.

6914. If approved, the volume will fill the West
End's capacity. We should know something by the
