BIGGEST PICNIC EVER!

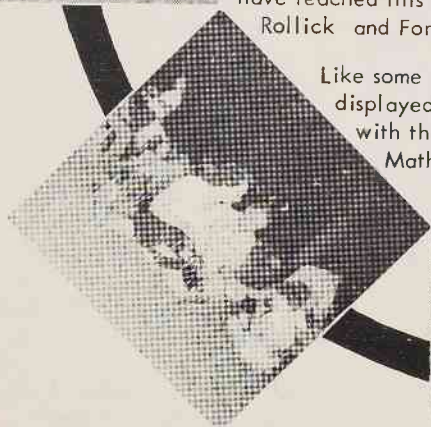
