COMPANY GAINS INCREASE 17% FOR 1955

Piedmont Airlines in 1955 flew 17% more passengers than in its previous record year, R. D. Hager, Vice President-Traffic, announced.

A total of 360,982 passengers rode Piedmont during the year for a load factor of 51.7%. In 1954 the passenger total was 308,194 and the load factor was 47.3%.

"We should carry about 397,080 passengers in 1956", Mr. Hager said, "and the load factor should be at least 53%."
