Mr. Northington and son, Bobby, spent a very enjoyable vacation in Los Angeles where they visited with Mr. Northington's relatives.

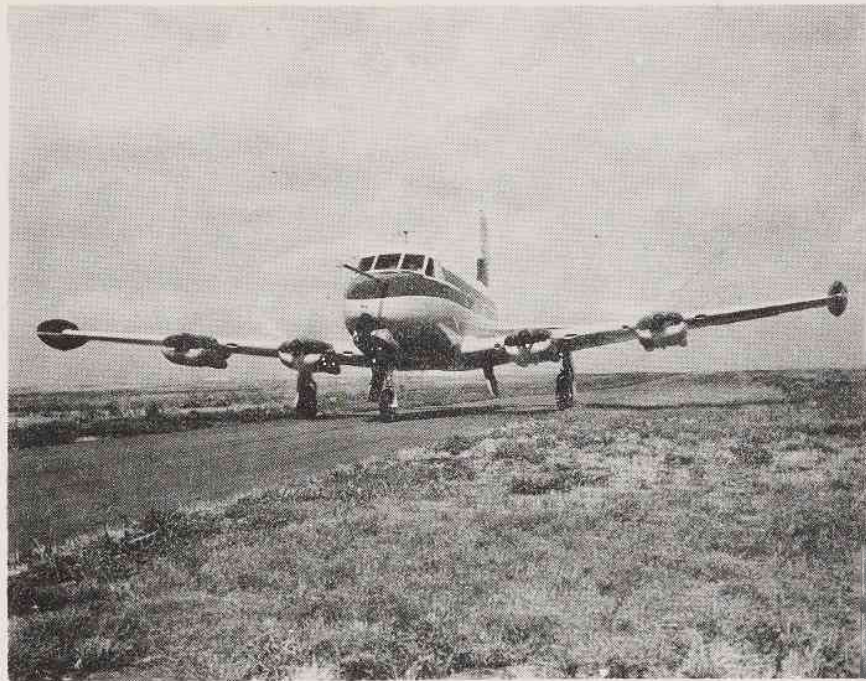
Kem Naftel has just returned from Florida where she obtained a very nice suntan. I understand Kem and her husband had quite a tour of Florida.
