Mr. & Mrs. Henry Holland, INT-Purchasing, have moved into their new home on Kenwood Street, Winston-Salem.



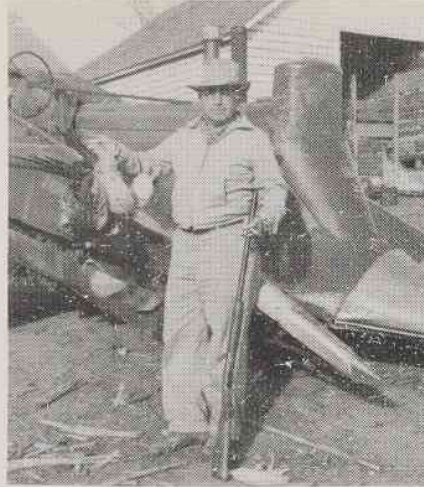
AN ODE TO THE OLD ABODE
