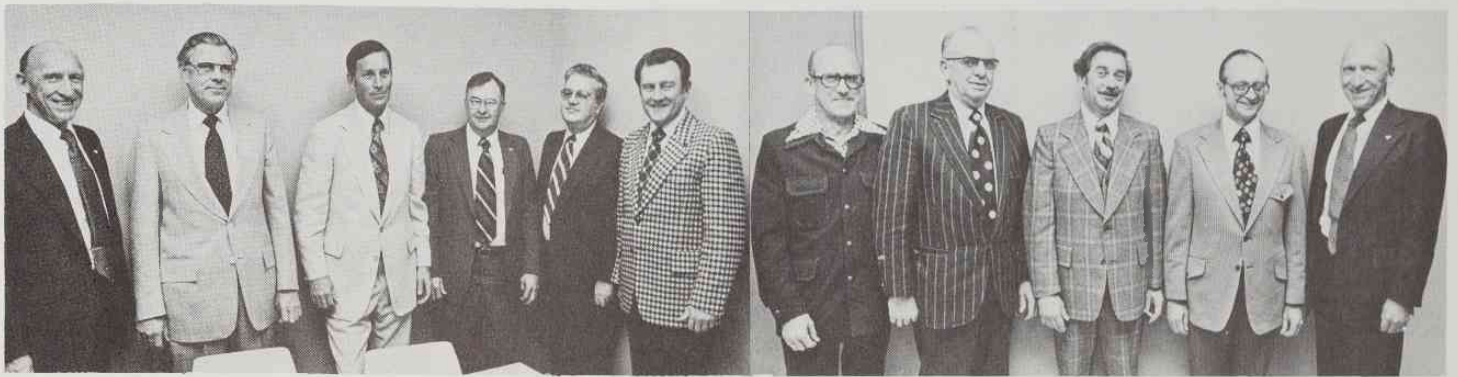


Old-timers recognized for 800+ years of service

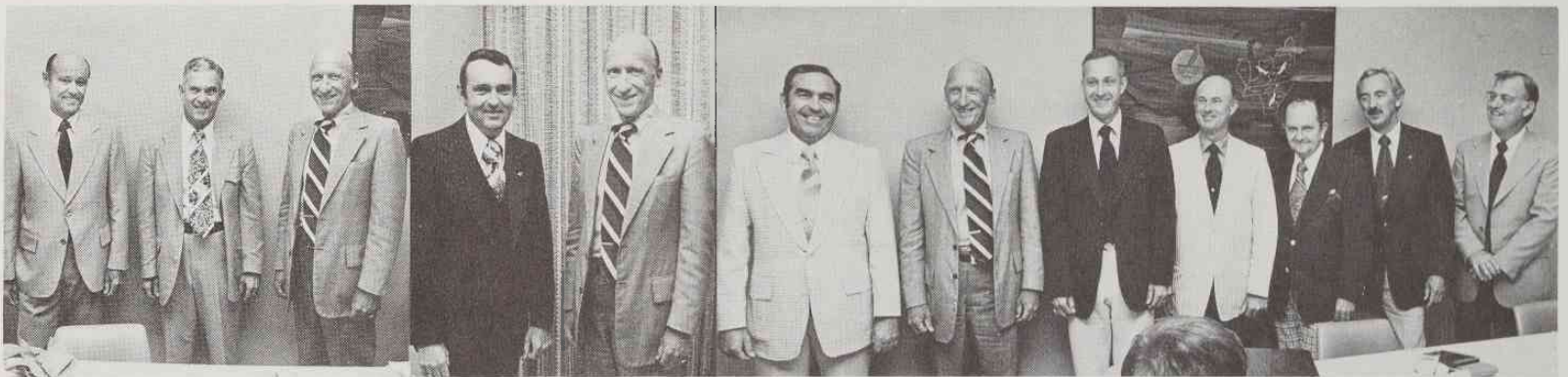


In October, the 30-year group included, from left, Doc Howard, Jack Jackson, Rope Easley and Bill McGee. President Davis presented the pins.

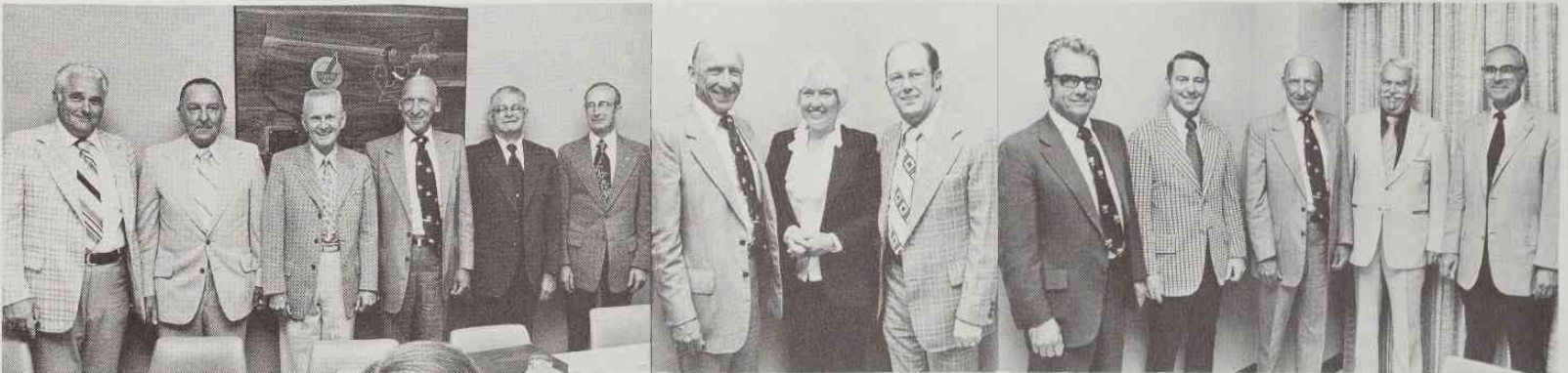
The 20-year group at the October gathering included, from left to right, George Gentry, Lester Salmon, Bill Sebastian and Lyle Cox, shown with President Davis.
