## JAs a good investment

Piedmont Productions may not be on the New York Stock Exchange or in any investor's portfolio, but it will probably pay a 50 percent dividend to stockholders of record this spring, a good return for a company only seven months old.

Piedmont Productions is the Winston-Salem Junior Achievement company sponsored by Piedmont this year. Organized in October 1980, the company has approximately 20 employees from the ninth through the twelfth grades in the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County schools. Their product — wooden frames for posters.

"They have set up a regular business and even pay wages — 40 cents an hour for those on the assembly line and a monthly salary for their officers," said Bill Shields, Purchasing, who is the

executive advisor for the company.

"They've sold over 325 poster frames this year, bringing in income of over \$1,000, a lot for a JA program."

Five other Piedmont employees are also among the volunteers for Piedmont Productions. Bill Asher, Marketing; Ray Bridges, Industrial Engineering; Jane Weston, Accounting; and J. B. Brogdon and Donnie Rhodes, both in CRO, have given more than 130 hours each to the project. Every Tuesday evening, October through April, they have met at Kernersville Junior High School, counseling the students on everything from marketing strategies to accounting procedures and production.

Piedmont has been active in the JA program since it was established in Winston-Salem in 1966.
