PI pilot and his father Take part in historic flight

Fifty years ago, the Sky Ghost — a Gross Four-Place Glider which at that time was the largest glider in the world — made its 1935 Akron-to-Columbus flight, marking the first time a multiplepassenger glider carried U.S. Mail.

On Saturday, June 29, 1985, a two-seat Grob 103 re-enacted the trip. Bernie Gross, a pilot for Piedmont, was at the controls.

Gross' father, Dr. Frank Gross, was involved with both flights. Already recognized in 1935 as an authority in the design of gliders, Dr. Gross drew the plans of the four-place glider which pioneered multiplace passenger gliders.

On the anniversary flight, Dr. Gross occupied the glider's passenger seat with his son at the controls. Gross observed that the problems of the original venture were solved by modern radio communications.

The *Sky Ghost* was built of wood, stiff linen cloth and steel; the Grob 103 is made of fiberglass and graphite.

Gross, who has been with Piedmont two years, is a first officer on the B-737, based at GSO.
