## - PIEDMONT FINAL MAIL RATE -

The retroactive final mail rate recently established for Piedmont Airlines by the C.A.B. is the lowest rate yet established for any of the local service airlines. The Board set .48¢ per recognized revenue mile as the amount to be paid Piedmont during its initial period of operation. The rate for future operations is set on a sliding scale basis, dependent upon load factors. The mail rate as set for us by the Board is one to be proud of and is made possible through operating efficiency and outstanding development of other revenues. Every effort has been and must be exerted to decrease our mail pay need.

## - SPRING SCHEDULE -

With the coming of daylight saving time April 29 most carriers are having a major schedule change. Ours is going to be quite radical. Not only will we have new flights, but we will also have new flight numbers.
