HIGHLANDS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

This season the Highlands Chamber of Commerce has answered four hundred letters of inquiry, and has handled approximately one hundred letters dealing with business matters. It has sent out around one thousand cards announcing events of interest to the town, and has answered telephone calls from practically every city in the southeast. It has replied to questions ranging from, "Is there a hotel in Highlands?" to, "Is there any way I can go from here without driving through the mountains?"

The Highlands Chamber of Commerce operates an extension ticket office for the Cherokee drama, "Unto These Hills", and has, since June 28, sold tickets amounting to \$ 225.00.

The Chamber of Commerce, co-operating with the town of Highlands, has sponsored a recreation center which is now open to the public, with facilities for badminton, horse shoes, tennis, and folk dancing.

It has contributed to a brochure being prepared for the National Forester's Convention to be held in Asheville in October, with a conducted tour which is scheduled to pass through Highlands. The Chamber of Commerce has also submitted an article on Highlands to the Asheville Citizen-Times' 1952 Vacation and Mail Away Issue to be published July 27.
