## THE BREVARD MUSIC CENTER

The highlights of the week at the Brevard Music Center are the Rodgers and Hammerstein Night, and the concerts by Eugene List and Carroll Glenn. The Saturday evening program of all Rodgers and Hammerstein music is a new feature in the Festival of Music, for this is the first time that the Music Center has presented a program of music derived entirely from Broadway hits. The performance will feature the Orchestra of the Faculty and Staff, conducted by James Christian Pfohl; and will also present the Choral Ensemble, with student and staff soloists under the direction of Gordon Page, singing selections from the Broadway musicals "Carousel," "Stage Door," "The King and I," "South Pacific," "Oklahoma," and the latest hit "Pipe Dream."

On Sunday, July 15, Eugene List, gifted American pianist, will be featured. Mr. List has been acclaimed by critics for his performances in concerts and recitals, and by audiences who have seen him on television and in the movie "Bachelor's Daughter." He has appeared 32 times with the New York Philharmonic. This Sunday at 4:00 he will play the Liszt Concerto in E-Flat, with the Transylvania Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of James Christian Pfohl.

On Tuesday evening at 8:15, the Music Center will present Eugene List's distinguished wife, Carroll Glenn, one of the world's most celebrated woman violinists. The richly endowed Miss Glenn, originally from South Carolina, was recently the subject of an article in the Saturday Evening Post, which described her as "one of the few really popular violinists."
