## GALAX THEATRE TO SPONSOR HOSPITAL BENEFIT

Walt Disney picture of the year --- Pollyanna --- with an all-star cast that includes Jane Wyman, Richard Egan, Donald Crisp and others, will be shown at the Galax Theatre Tuesday, August 23rd, as a benefit performance for the Highlands Community Hospital.

A print of the picture has been donated by the Walt Disney Corporation, through Buena Vista Pictures, their distributors, and was secured through the efforts of Mrs. Lillian C. Claughton, owner of the Claughton Theaters in Miami, Florida. Mrs. Claughton has been a summer visitor to the Highlands area for the past three summers.

The Galax Theatre is being donated for the occasion by Otto F. Summer, owner, of Highlands. The committee who will handle ticket sales has not yet been appoint-

ed, but will be announced soon.
