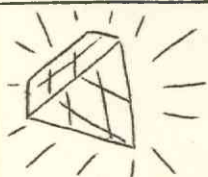
REV. SEWELL TO BE GUEST PREACHER AT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH SUNDAY
