MAJ. C. D. S. CLARKSON, PIONEER DEVELOPER, DIES

Major Charles D. S. Clarkson, a
well known and popular resident of High-
lands, died here July 11th at his resi-
dence. He was 85 years old.

Major Clarkson was one of the pio-
neer developers of scenic property in
the Highlands area, particularly of land
in the vicinity of Whiteside Mountain
and also of sites overlooking Blue Val-
ley. Owing to his engineering ability,
his skill as a landscape architect and
his imagination, he made available build-
ing locations which today are occupied
by many of Highlands (CON'D, PAGE 12)
