CAMP HIGHLANDER HOLDS ANNUAL HORSE SHOW

The sun shone brightly last Friday for Camp Highlander's seasonal highlight, its annual horse show. One hundred thirty-four campers of this co-educational camp, located atop Little Scaly Mountain outside Highlands, all participated by riding. In addition to these boys and girls, almost all the members of the staff and administration took their turn astride one of the fifteen horses in the show.

The horse show opened with a procession led by the official judges, Rodney Harper and Wallace Wilkins, and followed by representatives of the staff of Camp Highlander on horseback. After presentation of colors, a series of twentyfive classes of riding commenced. Each class consisted of six competing campers matched against fellow campers of equal experience and ability.
