"DADDY'S GONE A-HUNTING"

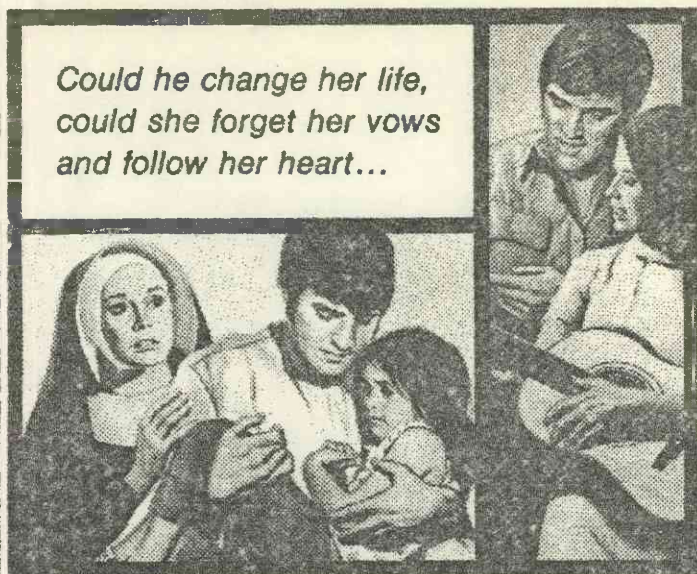
San Francisco-like cities that have nowhere to go but up, perhaps movie-makers must take that same vertical route to create something new in the cinema world.
