The announcement of the Annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Highlands-Cashiers Hospital as an open meeting to the public has been published in this paper last week and again this week. It is a very important meeting and all who are interested in the Hospital are invited to attend. It will be held at the Highlands School Auditorium on Thursday evening August 27, 1970 at 8 o'clock p.m. Mr. William F. Henderson, Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Medical Care Commission is the featured speaker and is well qualified to speak to audiences about hospitals and their operations. It is hoped a large group will attend the meeting and hear him speak.

It was hoped at this time to have the official word of APPROVAL for Medicare participation so that it might be published. The unofficial word is that

Until the actual official word is in hand, announcement of any kind is out of order, but there is a feeling of optimism prevailing and just as soon as the official word comes, it will be heralded as far as possible throughout the area.
