His experiences in Bast India, in Africa, in China, and in Europe acquaited him with the divergent characteristics of those peoples with whom and against whom the United States is fighting. Out of MS understanding of these people has grown Dr. Nash's desire to solve the fundamental problem of internation al anarchy.
