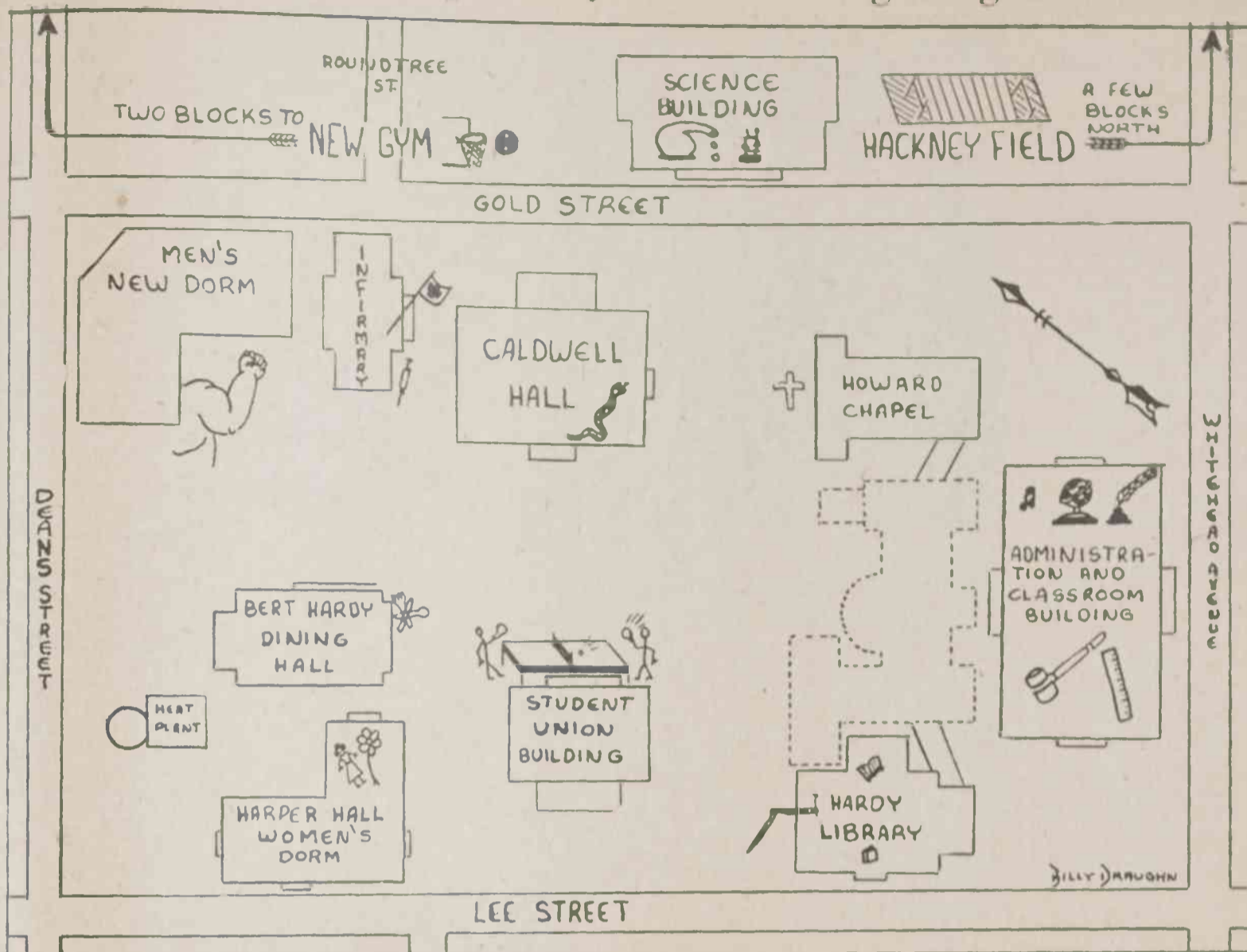


Artist's Conception Of ACC Building Program



Sites Being Cleared For New Buildings

Signs of progress on the ACC building program are popping up all over campus.

Hoffman House
