Eleven papers were given, two by AC students. William Owens presented a paper on "The Effects Different Chemicals Have on Tubercle Bacillus." William has been working on this paper for 2½ years at the state sanatorium. Carroll Kennedy gave a paper on "The Effects Different Temperatures Have on the Regeneration of Planaria." This research was done by Ray Tissot during his senior year at AC. All the papers showed extensive and high caliber work.

The Collegiate Academy was organized last year. William Owens was secretary and editor of the paper, CASCAS, which the academy published. Charles Carroll from UNC was elected president, William Owens, vice-president, and Margaret Holland of WCUNC secretary. Each college in the academy will have a representative at the executive meetings so as to promote more interest in the Collegiate Academy. The Academy will meet at Chapel Hill next year.
