Mrs. Bethany R. Joyner, College Registrar, said the remaining 26 students on probation were able to improve their grades enough to remove probation.

If a student falls more than 12 quality points behind at ACC, he goes on academic probation the

Sixty students were suspended for academic reasons at the conclusion of the spring semeser last June. Last January, 33 students were suspended.

Students who do not understand the academic probation rule, should check with their advisors. Students who are in trouble should make periodic visits to their advisors for guidance and help.
