# Cauthen Named To Region Post

CHAIRMAN of the Region V Selection Committee for the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation is Dean I. B. Cauthen, Jr. of the University of Virginia.

An associate professor of English and associate dean of the university's College of Arts and Sciences, Dean Cauthen has published in various journals in Elizabethan and seventeenth century literature, American literature and textual bibliography.

Competition for the 1,000 Woodrow Wilson Fellowships for 1963-64 is now under way. Any faculty member at any college or university in Delaware, the District of Columbia, Maryland, North Carolina, Virginia or West Virginia may send nominations to Dean Cauthen between now and October 31.

All candidates must file the required credentials with Dean Cauthen by November 20.

# Earlier Rush Week Discussed By IFC

A proposal to hold Rush Week one week earlier rather than during the week of Oct. 22-25, was made at the regular Interfraternity Council meeting. Sigma Pi representatives stated that the 10-week pledge-training period set up by the national fraternities was hard to follow when rush is late. They also pointed out that rush week is too close to mid-semester exams.

The Council decided that rush week would be held at the previously approved date because many of the Greek organizations had already made definite plans with the dates in the latter part of October in mind.

A proposition that the brothers and sisters hold separate rush weeks then came before the council; however,

it was quickly decided that the unity of brother-sister rush weeks should be maintained.

The Greek Sing Committee reported that, because of the relatively small sing of some fraternities, the sing would not be held until after rush week.

Jay Barnhill, president, announced that only one Greek organization has received social restrictions for this semester.
