

Basketball Coach Is Appointed Here

Ira P. Norfolk of Blacksburg, according to Dr. Arthur D. Wenger, president of the college.

Dr. Wenger told The Collegiate Tuesday "The faculty athletic committee had recommended that we combine the athletic directorship with the post of head basketball coach and we believe that the appointment of Norfolk brings fine strength to both positions and will allow the college athletic program to develop in a wholesome way, consistent with the aims and objectives of Atlantic Christian College."

Presently Norfolk is serving as assistant director of athletics and business manager of athletics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute. He will assume his duties at ACC on Sept.

A native of Baltimore, Md. he received the A. B. degree from the University of North Carolina where he was a member of the 1945 Southern Conference Basketball championship team and the 1946 NCAA Eastern Basketball championship

As a head basketball coach he has accumulated a record of 281 victories and 66 losses in nine years. His teams have won 16 out of 21 tournaments. As coach of two All-Marine Corps championship teams he has participated in the National AAU Championships and the Pan-Am Trials.
