## Crenshaw Is New Religion Teacher

James L. Crenshaw of Nashville, Tenn., has been appointed assistant professor in the Department of Religion at Atlantic Christian College, according to Dr. Arthur D. Wenger, president of the college.

A native of Cateche, S. C. he was graduated magna cum laude from Furman University with the B. A. degree and was first in his class at Southern Baptist Seminary where he was awarded the B. D. degree. He is currently completing his Ph. D. degree in Biblical Studies at Vanderbilt University.

While studying at Vanderbilt he was a teaching assistant in New Testament in the Divinity School. Last Summer he did archeological work in Palestine on a fellowship from the Hebrew Union College Biblical and Archeological School in Jerusalem.

According to Dr. William E. Tucker, chairman of the ACC Department of Religion and Philosophy, Crenshaw's appointment will strengthen the department in the areas of Biblical languages. He will introduce a two year course in New Testament Greek and will teach advanced courses in the Biblical area.

The appointment also emphasizes the ACC Religion Department's appeal to students of all denominational traditions. Crenshaw is a Southern Baptist, while other members of the department are members of the Methodist and the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ).

## Bowers Speaks

Dr. Fredson T. Bowers, chairman of the English department at the University of Virginia, was the keynote speaker at the annual Shakespeare Festival on May 8. Dr. Bowers received his degrees from Princeton, Harvard and Brown.

The theme of the discussion was Hamlet. Following the talk a reception was held for those in attendance. The reception was given by the faculty of the English department, and refreshments were served in the faculty lounge.

Also on the program with Dr. Bowers was the school vocal ensemble, which gave a program consisting of songs popular during the Elizabethan period.

## Basketball Coach Is Appointed Here

Ira P. Norfolk of Blacksburg, Va. has been appointed head basketball coach and director of athletics at Atlantic Christian College, according to Dr. Arthur D. Wenger, president of the college.

Dr. Wenger told The Collegiate Tuesday "The faculty athletic committee had recommended that we combine the athletic directorship with the post of head basketball coach and we believe that the appointment of Norfolk brings fine strength to both positions and will allow the college athletic program to develop in a wholesome way, consistent with the aims and objectives of Atlantic Christian College."

Presently Norfolk is serving as assistant director of athletics and business manager of athletics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute. He will assume his duties at ACC on Sept. 1, 1964.

A native of Baltimore, Md. he received the A. B. degree from the University of North Carolina where he was a member of the 1945 Southern Conference Basketball championship team and the 1946 NCAA Eastern Basketball championship team.

As a head basketball coach he has accumulated a record of 281 victories and 66 losses in nine years. His teams have won 16 out of 21 tournaments. As coach of two All-Marine Corps championship teams he has participated in the National AAU Championships and the Pan-Am Trials.
