The Executive Board, meeting Dec. 11, made a firm stand against a new ruling on class absences passed by the Central Committee on Instruction Nov. 25

The regulation approved by the committee required immediate dismissal of any student who cuts 25 per cent of the class sessions in 50 per cent of his courses.

The ruling by the committee read in its entirety:

"To become effective with the spring semester 1969, any regularly enrolled student who is absent from 25 per cent of the total class meeting times in 50 (or more) per cent of his courses in
