The Charter also has established a 25-year minimum age requirement for trustees, thus making it difficult for a student to be elected to the board. If the Charter is to be changed, the changes must be initiated by the trustees, then be approved by the Church Assembly.

Although no formal motion was made providing for student representation, Cooke feels that there was enough interest generated so that if the trustees do not originate any action between now and next year, then a resolution will be introduced at next year's assembly meeting. When asked about the possibility of such a resolution being passed, Cooke remarked, "It's just a matter of speculation."

name of ACC." Wyndham was accused of "flagrant disregard for basic law and order" and of transferring the same implication to all the students of ACC. The resolution strongly reprimanded Wyndham and also the National Student Association for trying to make implications concerning the whole of the student body. The resolution was in reference to an AP release stating that Wyndham had agreed to go to jail rather than submit to the draft.

Jim Abbott spoke in defense of the individual's right to free speech. He pointed out to the board that the AP news release was somewhat in error. Wyndham, he said, had not agreed to going to jail but only sympathized with those who would. O'Connell told the Board that a "person in a place of leadership has to be very careful what he does in public. O'Connell was primarily interested in Wyndham's stand on law and order. He was afraid that people will think there are "a bunch of radicals in the student body."

Wyndham, in a statement to the Board, said that going to jail was not a disregard for law. It is acknowledging and willingly accepting the consequences of

breaking the law. The move, he said, was not unprecedented, and he cited a similar public stand taken by former president Doug Dexter. Harold Herring urged Wyndham to clear up his stand with the press. The motion to approve the resolution received only one vote.

Wilkins urgently pleaded with the Board for a motion concerning an ex officio student on the Board of Trustees. He expressed the opinion that the SGA president should be involved at this level. The motion came from Jim Abbott. Dr. Bennett pointed out to the Board that the Student Life Committee had already taken such action in a more specific vein. The committee's recommendation would put a student on the Education Committee of the Board of Trustess. with privileges of attending meetings of the full Board. The Education Committee is concerned with matters particularly and relevant to students. The motion the on the floor was brought into acce harmony with Student Life's WS recommendation and received not unanimous approval.
