
The 1969-70 Atlantic Christian ollege Handbook records many ile changes. These new rules fect both men and women esident students.

Sign-In and -Out cards for omen are compulsory now only iter 7:00 PM or for trips out of wn, instead of the every-timeou - leave-campus routine. ports clothes are now perlitted at home sports events for male residents. Liberty passes em to claim avid attention. ay permission for Freshmen is special permission only first emester but extends to include econd semester made within a fty-mile radium. Sophomores re also limted to weekends, but ley have a radius of one hunred miles in which to travel, miors advanced to "any day the status but must remain ithin a one hundred mile adius. Seniors are unlimited.

The freshmen women boast of curfew extension to a half-hour midnight and upperclassmen 1:00 a.m. Second semester reshmen welcome the inovations of unlimited eekends. Sophomores are ranted two nights out instead of traditional one, While uniors and Seniors revel in an nlimited number.

Second semester Freshmen ttain the privileged ranks by ualifying for blanket pernission. As the name suggests, a ermission signed by the arents covers any weekend trip xcept beach parties. Special lay-by-play permission is no onger required.

The biggest innovation for tale residents is the dress code.

Bennett who has accepted a position at the University of South Carolina. Prior to the new appointment he served for two years in the college's Division of Development as director of alumni affairs.

A native of Farmville, Whitehurst received the A.B. degree from Atlantic Christian

College and was awarded the M. Ed. degree by the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Prior to his appointment to the college administration in 1967, he served as a teacher


