On the other hand, Pembroke State fell to its first district lossin three outings and stands 11-10 on the year. Norman, the Braves' sensational left-hander, saw a personal five-game victory string halted and now posses a $5-3$ ledger. Numerous pro scouts were on


hand and they might have found themselves viewing the wrong left-hander. Arthur was clearly the sharper in notching his firs victory against one loss.
Arthur spaced six hits and survived a tendency to be wild the latter innings.
