## Yeats Speaks at ACC

WILSON -- Sen. Michael Yeats, the son of Ireland's most famous poet, William Butler Yeats, and a distinguished statesman in his own right, will deliver a series of lectures on literature and European economics at Atlantic Christian College, on March 25-26. He will be accompanied by his wife, Grainne, an accomplished harpist and singer of Irish folk ballads, who will present a program of Irish songs and ballads.

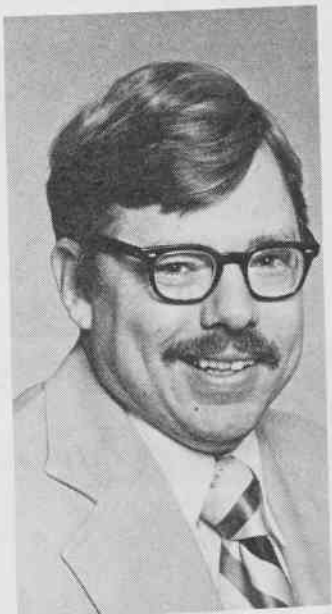
The senator and his wife are two of modern Ireland's most distinguished leaders in cultural and political affairs. Sen. Yeats served as chairman of the Irish Senate from 1969 to 1973. He resigned from that position to become a member of the European Parliament on Ireland's accession to the Common Market. He is now vice-president of the nine-nation parliament. Mrs. Yeats has performed on concert tours of Russia and the Far East, as well as in the United States.

Two events are scheduled for Tuesday, March 25. Sen. Yeats will speak on "W. B. Yeats and His Family," at 1:30 p.m., in Hardy Alumni Hall. Mrs. Yeats will perform "Irish Songs and Ballads," at 8 p.m., in the choral room of Hackney Music Building.

The Yeats' will make two appearances on Wednesday, March 26. The senator and his wife will speak on "The Role of Music in the Works of W. B. Yeats," at 2:30 p.m. He will speak on "The European Common Market," at 8 p.m. Both events will be in Hardy Alumni Hall.

The first three programs are sponsored by the ACC Department of English. The lecture on the European Common Market is sponsored by the ACC chapter of Pi Gamma Mu.

WILSON, N.C. -- Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Jefferies Jr., of Wilson, are serving as co-chairmen of the Alumni Parents Division of the Atlantic Christian College Development Council, according to R. E. Kirkland Jr., chairman of the council.

They are among a group of noted business and industrial leaders, professional and civic leaders who are chairing divisions on the council. The council is conducting a continuing program to secure \$22 million over a 10-year period to upgrade the college's overall operations. Funds secured through the select group will be utilized for enlarging and improving the college's facilities and substantially increasing its endowment.

Jefferies said he is giving his support to Atlantic Christian College because, "Atlantic Christian College is an important part of Wilson's history and

a necessary and essential part of Wilson's future."

He is general manager for Belk-Tyler Stores of Wilson and has 42 years of service with the company. He received the A. B. degree from Lenoir-Rhyne College, completed the executive program at East Carolina University, the advanced executive training program at Georgia State, and the executive development program at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Active in the civic affairs of his community, Jefferies has served as president of the Rotary Club of Wilson; vice-president of the Wilson Chamber of Commerce; chairman of the Wilson United Way;
