**T-SHIRTS** shall be awarded to the co-ed teams, individual/dual sport champions upon conclusion of the play-off tournament.

## ART EXHIBIT

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Selected works from the North Carolina Artists Competition exhibit, the state art collection of R. J. Reynolds Industries, Inc., will be on public display at the Hines Gallery of the Rocky Mount Arts and Crafts Center, Sept. 7-26.

A special opening for the exhibition, the first of the fall 1980 season at the gallery, will be Sunday, Sept. 7, from 3 to 7 p.m. Regular gallery hours are 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday -- Friday.

The Rocky Mount exhibition is the last scheduled showing of work from the 139-piece RJR collection, which has been on a two-year regional tour.

R. J. Reynolds sponsored a series of eight competitions for

state artists in cities across North Carolina in 1977 to generate art works for its corporate headquarters.

Over 4,000 entries were received, making it the largest juried art competition ever held in the state. A panel of four jurors selected works for the purchase awards.
