The Division of Social Sciences has been on the move with several different activities and programs this semester.

The Division began by welcoming two new faculty: Matthew Redinger as assistant professor of history, and Yusef Talukdar as associate professor of accounting.

Now the division has 14 full-time faculty, and nine hold the terminal degree in their field of studies.

Sixty-four percent of the faculty hold doctorate degrees, making the division closer to the minimum percentage of 70 percent proposed by the College.

Baffour AgyemanDuah who serves as head of the division said, "My colleagues and I are working hard to strengthen the programs of the division. We've made a lot of positive changes, but there's still room for improvement."

Agyeman-Duah, who is also an assistant professor political science, recently represented the social science division of Bennett College when he presented a research paper at the 1993 International Studies Association Southern Conference at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery, Ala.

He also signed a contract with the University Press of America to publish
his 240-page book dealing with the Cold War policy of the United States arming other countries for proxy activities.

Other faculty members are actively participating in various programs as well.

Victoria Burke, acting chair of Social Work and Sociololgy, completed a faculty internship with the bureau of Land Management of the Department of the Interior in Phoenix.

Micheal Reed, assistant professor of psychology, served as assistant director of the Math Science Scholars Program's summer camp program here on Bennett's campus.
"This program was a great experience for me and an even greater one for the children," Reed said.
"Some of the kids were clearly turned on to careers in math and science."

The majors in the division are as active as their faculty. Students in the Psychology Department participated in several different summer programs including internships at Bowling Green State University in the Graduate Professional Opportunity Program; NHLBI Behavioral Medicine in the Department of Epidemiology and Clinical Application; the University of South Carolina Department of Psychology for Experimental Psychology;
