"My honesty and ability to make the freshman understand how Bennett's rich history and nurtur-

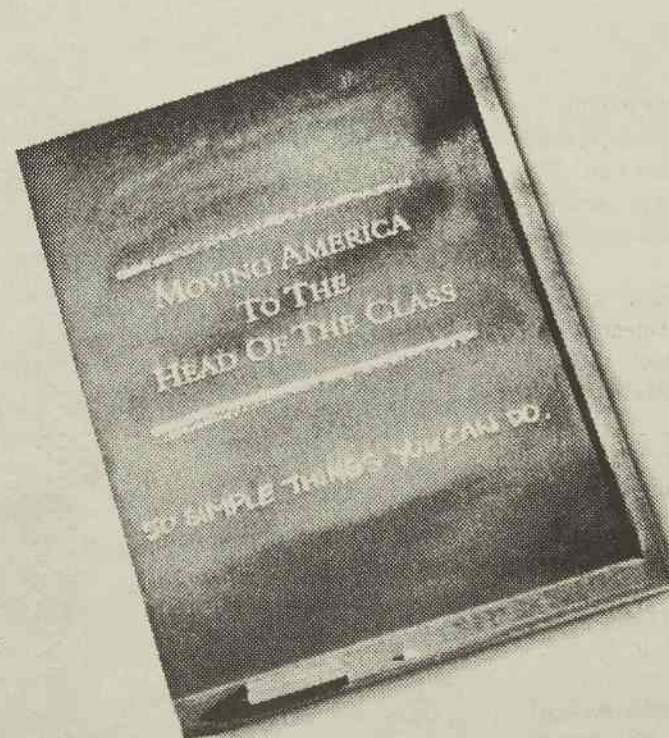
