Davis was honored as a finalist for Youth Citizen of the Year in her hometown this year.• **7, 1979 Edith Sampson**, the first black woman to be named an official representative to the United Nations, died in Chicago at the age of 78.• **24, 1980 Monica**, R&B singer was born. Monica's hits include, "The Boy is Mine," "First Night" and "Street Symphony."• **26, 1952 Hattie McDaniel**, the first African American to receive an Academy Award, dies at the age of 54.• **27, 1951, Jayne Kennedy**, former actress was born. Kennedy was also the first African American female to be a sportscaster on network television.• **31, 1900 Ethel Waters** was born. 'Chicken Soup' for students:
a collection of laughter, tears

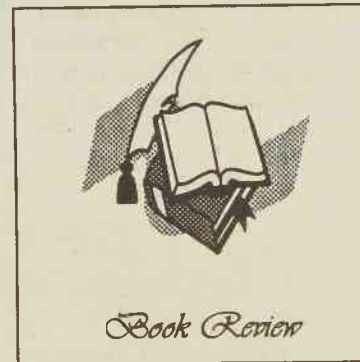
(NAPS)-Now there's one more thing parents can pack for Bennett Belles -- a special edition of a best-selling book series dedicated especially to the college student.

The college years are a time of transition for students -- and their parents -- as students experience some challenging life lessons and move toward adulthood. "Chicken Soup for the College Soul" (Health Communications, Inc., \$12.95) captures the confusion of collegiate emotions in the vivid and empathetic manner that the "Chicken Soup for the Soul" series is known for.

Co-written by Kimberly Kirberger, Jack Canfield, Mark Victor Hansen and Dan Clark, the book captures the laughter and tears, triumphs and trepidations and joys and fears associated with the college years.

Chapters include "Getting In," which illustrates the humor and frustration involved in trying to

get into the special school; "Transition," which covers the difficulty for students (and parents) when a child leaves home for the first time; "Tough Stuff," which deals with tough decisions and tragedies; "Lessons" learned both in and outside the classroom; "Love 101"; "Acts of Kindness"; "Friends";

"Mind Over Matter"; and "Graduation."

One story, "A Dad Says Goodbye," shared the excitement of a parent who remembers

bringing his daughter home from the hospital as she is setting up her college dorm. His memories help him prepare for the fact that she won't be coming home when he and his wife leave.

Another story, "Some Professors Are Smarter Than You Think," tells the story of four college students who faked an excuse for missing their chemistry final and thought they could get away with it, but ace the class.

As smart as these A students were, their professor found a way to outsmart them.

As with the other books in the series, "Chicken Soup for the College Soul" is bound to leave an indelible impression on readers showing that no matter what your age, you're never too old for some Chicken Soup.
