### Ecusta Now Tied For First Place In Bowling League

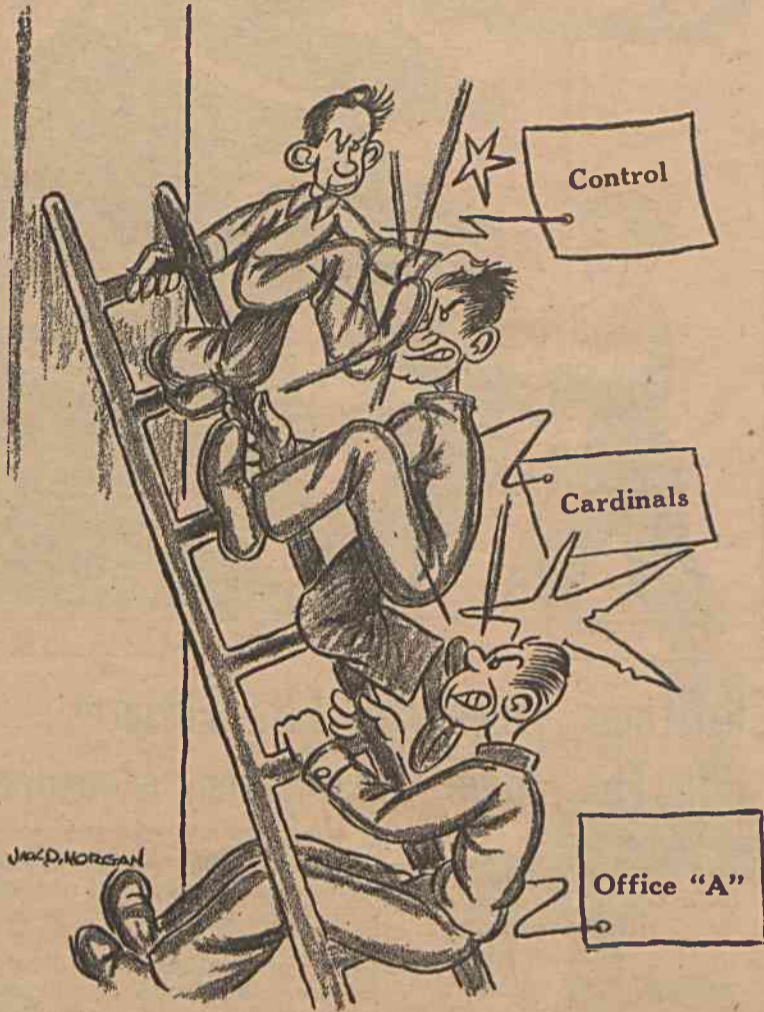
