A daughter, Katherine Alene, was born September 6 to Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hollingsworth. Mr. Hollingsworth works in Finishing.

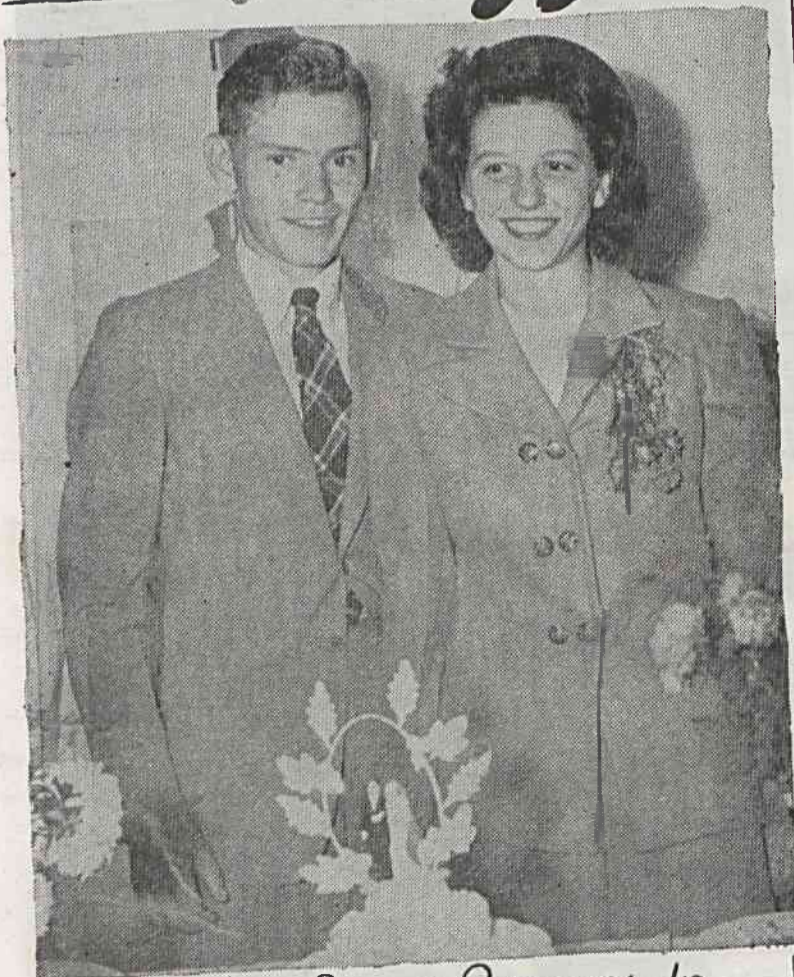
Sharon Rae Scruggs
