Both Mr. and Mrs. Hill are employed in the Finishing department. They are making their home in Hendersonville.

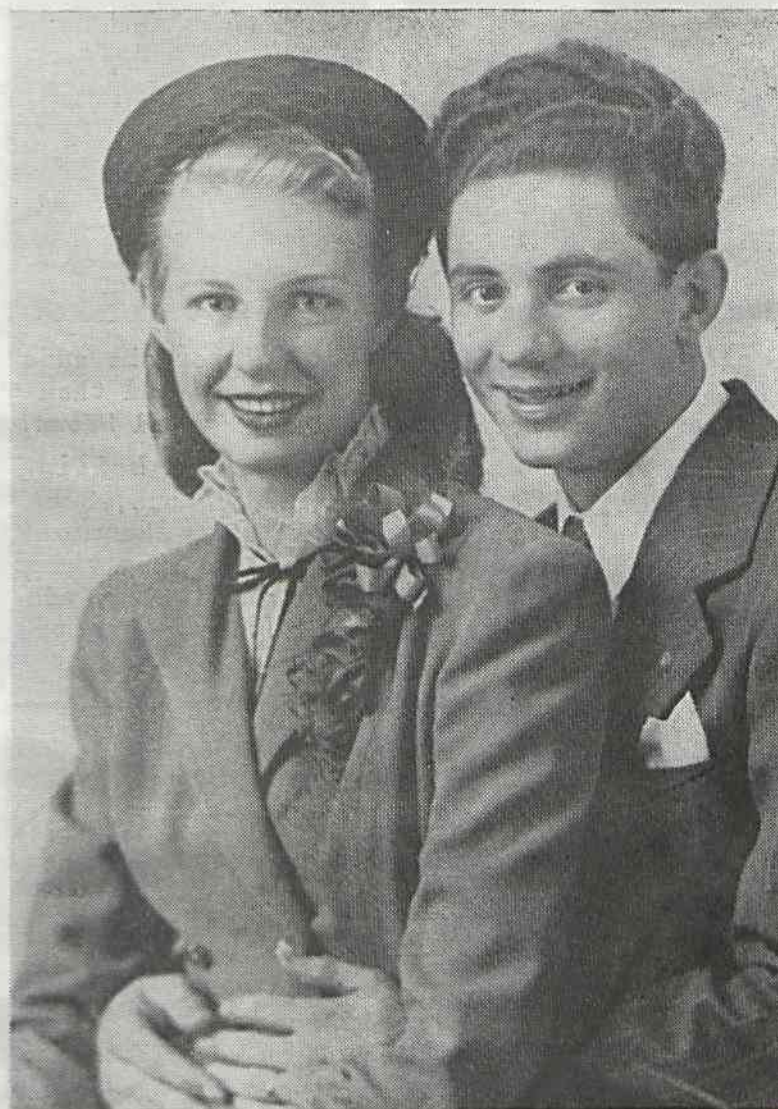
Whitaker-Praytor Wedding Announced
