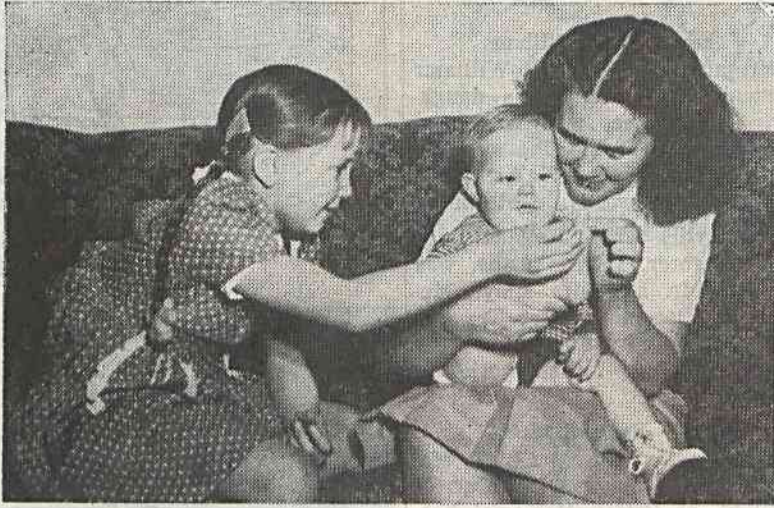


Meet The Wife - And The Children
