

The preparation of the checks and letters for our Job Dividend entailed a tremendous amount of work.

It might interest you to know that it took over 10,000 calculations to establish the Job Dividend which each employee received, and you can realize that so much clerical work takes a long time. Our staff of accountants worked overtime evenings and on Saturdays to finish this work. It also entailed the issuing of over 1,700 checks and a like number of envelopes were addressed by our typists.

These are only a few of the steps necessary in the preparation and distribution of a letter, such as the one all of us recently received.

YOUR ADDRESS IS IMPORTANT

It is extremely important that all employees keep the Person nal Department informed as to their correct address telephone number, etc.
